Scripture: Genesis 3

Title: The Fall

Preacher: Pastor Steve Winstead

What did the Serpent and Eve say about God and his commands in verses 1-5 that create confusion and helped lead to Adam and Eve's disobedience?

What things did Eve perceive to be desirable in the fruit that she was forbidden to eat by God? What connection can be made between desire and disobedience?

Adam and Eve hid themselves from God, why? How do we hide ourselves from God or other accountability?

In this account, where was Adam while the serpent was talking to Eve? Why didn't Adam do anything to stop this conversation?

Adam shifted the blame for his sin, where have you seen blame-shifting and covering up in your own life?

Re-read Genesis 3:21. How did God cover up Adam and Eve's shame? What does this teach us about God? About sacrifice?

The same word for "cover or cloth" (verse 21) is used to also mean to forgive. How does this help you understand forgiveness?

What truth in this chapter is most important for you?

What does this tell you about human nature?

What does it tell you about God's nature? How are you struggling with the effects of the Fall right now?

Prayer:

- Read and pray Psalm 119:9-16 verse by verse in your smaller groups.
- Disobedience to God's Word led to the Fall and all of human suffering.
Treasuring God's Word leads to redeeming and restoring the brokenness left by sin.
